All the Salmonidce have eight fins, namely, two pectoral or breast fins; two ventral fins, on the belly next below the pectorals; the anal fin, behind the ventral fins; the caudal or tail fin; and two dorsal or back fins--the hindermost of which is very small, fleshy, and without rays.
